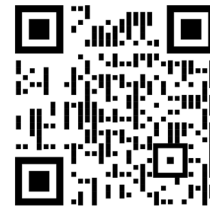


Bookstore, Room S-216

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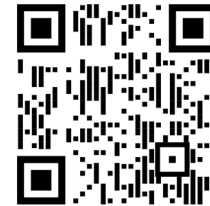
Advocacy & Resource Center, Room S-230

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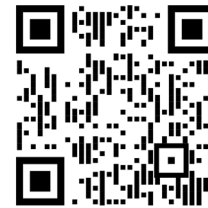


BMCC Cafeteria, 2nd Floor

Academic Advisement & Transfer Center, Room S-108

Advisors also provide guidance in transferring to a four-year college. Although meeting with an advisor once a semester is mandatory, advisors are available in-person and online throughout the semester to answer any questions.

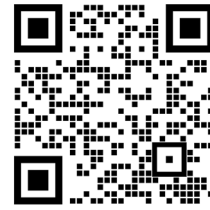
STOP 7

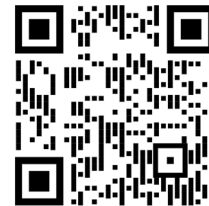
Veterans Resource Center, Room S-115M

BMCC takes pride in offering support to U.S. veterans in their pursuit of higher education through the Veterans Resource Center. The Center offers a range of services to aid student veterans, reservists, National Guard, and military-connected family members with their VA/GI Bill entitlements, VA enrollment certifications, and connections to on-campus and community services. Additionally, peer-to-peer mentoring is available for student veterans, while graduate social work interns from PROVE provide additional support for readjustment and transition challenges.



BMCC Service Desk, Room S-141

The Service Desk offers informational resources and technical assistance to students. The City University of New York and the BMCC Service Desk collaborate to deliver telecommunications and information technology services to the BMCC community. Access to Desktop Support, CUNYfirst troubleshooting, Email Account Setup, Wireless Access, MAC Support, Printer Support, Telecom Support, Service Alerts, and the General Student Computing Lab are all provided by the Service Desk.



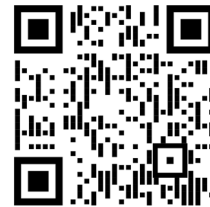
Office of the Bursar, Room S-330

Center for Career Development, Room S-342

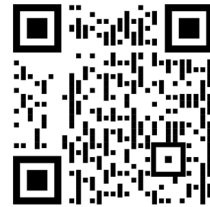

Counseling Center, Room S-343

At the Counseling Center, students have access to a variety of resources that promote their overall well-being. Confidential therapy sessions are available as well as events and activities that provide a much-needed break from the rigors of academic life. Among the offerings are free massages, ice cream socials, and other activities that are designed to help students unwind and de-stress. Whether it's during a particularly difficult season or just as a way to take a break, the Counseling Center is here to support students in their journey towards mental and emotional health.



Library, Room S-430

The BMCC library, named after civil rights activist A. Philip Randolph, offers a wide variety of resources with a collection of approximately 120,000 print books and 480,000 electronic books. Additionally, CUNY students have access to all CUNY libraries, providing a vast network of resources for research and study. Even better, the BMCC library offers free delivery services, assistive technology library liaisons, laptop and iPad lending, and a Book Chapter Scanning Service.



Learning Resource Center, Room S-510

The Learning Resource Center (LRC) offers a variety of services to ensure that all students have access to the tools and resources they need to succeed.

One of the most popular services provided by the LRC is Peer-Assisted Learning, or PAL for short. PAL gives students the opportunity to work with a peer who has already successfully completed the course and can provide them with tips, advice, and guidance. Students can also work with a trained tutor to better understand course material and improve their study skills. Tutoring sessions can be arranged one-on-one or in small groups, depending on the student's needs.

The Center provides Academic Coaching for students who may be struggling academically or need help staying on track; Instructional Computer Services and a range of Digital/Instructional Material including textbooks, study guides, online courses, and other resources that can be accessed from anywhere at any time.



Internships and Experiential Learning, Room S-750

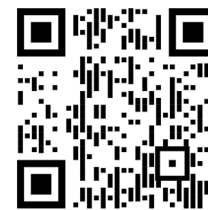
Internships and experiential learning provide opportunities to test out potential career paths and gain practical experience, which can lead to college credits. While internships offer short-term work experiences, apprenticeship programs provide specialized skills training for long-term employment. Additionally, students can connect with many industries at annual career fairs and explore diverse job prospects.

Through the joint efforts with academic departments and the Internships & Experiential Learning Office, students can participate in study abroad programs, lasting anywhere from 2 to 4 weeks in destinations such as Spain, Brazil, and beyond, where they gain valuable experiences that broaden their horizons.



Sky Deck Bridge, 3rd Floor, Southside

The Bridge provides a connection between the North and South sides of the main building. With stunning views of the Manhattan and New Jersey skyline, the lounge area serves as a gathering space for students during breaks between classes to socialize with fellow students, study, or just relax.

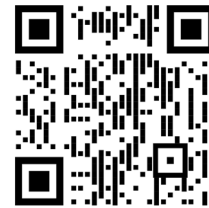


Early Childhood Center, Room N-375
