## Video Arts and Technology A.S.



The Video Arts and Technology (VAT) program provides a dynamic education in video, audio and television production. VAT students work in a digital environment in BMCC's state-of-the-art television studios, audio studio and postproduction laboratories. Students learn the entire process for creating professional video and audio programs from writing a script and creating a budget, to shooting a scene and editing a final cut. All VAT students complete an internship at a professional media facility. Upon successful completion of the program requirements, students earn an Associate in Science (A.S.) degree. Most courses in the Video Arts and Technology program (VAT courses) are restricted to students enrolled in the program.
